### What is good art?

1. Concept – there is an idea or emotion the artist wants to express

What is the big idea? What is the point? Why did they make this?

### What is good art?

2. Construction – the artist uses materials and forms them in a skillful way (the vehicle)

What is it made of?

What style or techniques were used?

Is it big or small?

Where is it presented?

## What is good art?

**3. Conversation** – The art should have an effect on the audience—perhaps they learn or experience something new when they encounter the art, or consider a different perspective. Then, they can continue the conversation by discussing their experience of the art with others.

How do or how did people **react** to this art?

Did this art cause any controversy?

What is your personal reaction to this work?

Did other artists or members of society respond to this art?

How do you feel when you observe this art?

#### Formal Presentation

You will present one work of visual art to the class in a 3 minute presentation accompanied by a PowerPoint of **4 slides**. The slides must follow this EXACT format:

- 1. A slide with ONLY text: the name of the work, the artist, and the context of the art (maybe the location, the year it was produced, or the movement or genre are relevant)
- 2. A slide with ONLY ONE large, high quality image, that will help you describe the CONCEPT of the work.
- 3. A slide with ONLY ONE large, high quality image, that will help you describe the CONSTRUCTION of the work.
- 4. A slide with ONLY ONE large, high quality image, that will help you describe the CONVERSATION generated by the work.
